Foundation's key achievements in 2022

- ✓ We began cooperation with new partners: **OCHA, Street Child, The Life Is Good Playmaker Project, and the Office of the Ombudsman of Ukraine.**
- ✓ We engaged about **700 children and 200 adults** in educational activities as part of the «Radity zнову» project (Kyiv region).
- ✓ We implemented **22 activities** for more than **200 children** with the support of **GETEC Group.**
- ✓ About **200 specialists** specialists were provided with an effective tool in the form of the «Planet Ridni» hand theatre for working with children.
- ✓ We involved more than **150 children** in educational, cultural and sports events as part of the educational project «**I am from Ukraine**».
- ✓ More than **130 children** were involved in cultural development as part of the «**Theatre for Kids**» project.
- ✓ We held art workshops for more than **100 children, from modular towns.**
- ✓ A year-long support program for **10 families in difficult life circumstances** was launched.
- ✓ **50 children** took part in art workshops as part of the «**Sporidneni**» project.

«Kein Kind sollte den Krieg sehen», sagt Mariana Romaniak. Deshalb machte sie sich mit über 130 ukrainischen Waisenkindern und den Betreuerinnen nach Kriegsbeginn auf die Flucht vor den Bombenangriffen von Putins Armee. Die Kinder sind im Alter zwischen mehreren Monaten und 18 Jahren.

Romaniak ist die Direktorin der Stiftung Ridni, welche die Kinder in der Stadt Lviv betreut. Weil es dort ständig Fliegeralarm gab und die Gefahr von Angriffen stieg, sind die Betreuer und Betreuerinnen mit den Kindern nach Polen geflüchtet. Doch dort müssen sie jetzt weg.

Full cycle programs

Family-type orphanages

Since 2016, the Foundation has been supporting **2 family-type orphanages in Lviv**, established with the assistance of the city department of the Service for Children.

As of today, **20 orphans** live confidently and safely in their new homes. They are cared for by caring foster parents and psychologists who provide them with the best possible conditions and opportunities for growth and development.

2022 was full of events:

The children continue their education at educational institutions, and some have already started their careers and found their first jobs.

**Municipal Institution Centre for Social Support of Children and Families

The main goal of the «Ridni» Centre is to preserve the family and return the child to his or her family.

As part of its support for the Centre, the Foundation helps with conducting classes and workshops for children.

At the beginning of the full-scale war, the Centre became a temporary shelter for children and their guardians who were forced to leave their homes and subsequently evacuated to safety.

The Centre has an «Urgent Accommodation of Children» department for temporary accommodation and social protection of children without parental care, orphans and children deprived of parental care, children in difficult life circumstances, abandoned, found and abandoned children aged from birth to 18 years, as well as a «Family Support Service» department.

«**Spilnota**» — is a unique centre that aims to provide comprehensive support and development for young people and help break the cycle of orphanhood by preparing teenagers for independent living.

Young people (boys and girls) from boarding schools, family-based care and young people from families in difficult living conditions affected by the war, aged 16 to 23, will live and study here.

Our goal:

is to prepare adolescents for independent living, create an environment for developing their own skills and talents, learning about themselves and the world, forming a community of active and successful young people and laying a solid foundation for a moral and social position.

Project implementation date — August 2023



The project is being implemented in cooperation with the «Ridni» Charitable Foundation and the Lviv City Council's Children's Service.

Business representatives also contributed to the implementation of the space, in particular, the construction and development company Avalon, which donated the premises, and the international company GETEC, which assisted financially.

Rejoice Again

Project in Kyiv region

The main goal of the project

Is to empower children and adults affected by war with valuable skills and techniques for further recovery and coping with stress.

- The project involved **970 participants**, including about **819 children**.
- About **100 educational and psychological events** were held.
- We provided material and resource support in the amount of **1,5 million UAH** million to equip a shelter in Bucha school and improve technical facilities in Fastiv school.

The project was implemented in the Kyiv region, namely in: Bila Tserkva, Motyzhyn, Bucha, Tetiiv and Fastiv.

Is ensuring the socio-cultural, sporting and psychological development of children, including those who were forced to leave their homes due to the war, children deprived of parental care and children from families in difficult life circumstances.

The project included about **50 different events** for more than **150 participants**.

Guardians of Childhood

A new phase

In 2022, the Guardians of Childhood project was implemented in partnership with The Life Is Good Playmaker Project, an American organisation.

Together, we launched a psychosocial recovery initiative aimed at training adult professionals working with children to protect the social and emotional well-being of children.

As part of the cooperation, **40 specialists** in the field of work with children took part in the training and gained valuable skills in creating corrective experiences through intentional play. Among them were specialists from the Lviv City Children's Services, the Ridni Centre for Social Support of Children and Families, and the foundation's team.

As part of the cooperation, we held **22 events** for **200 children** between the ages of 5 and 17.

Theatre for Kids

Charity project

The Theatre for Kids project is a programme of aesthetic education, social adaptation and development of creative abilities through the involvement of children in theatre.

This year, we managed to attend **6 wonderful performances** and engage **more than 130 children** to cultural development within the project. The children also saw the backstage of the theatre, met the actors, and took part in a reflection session with the foundation's psychologists.

Project goal

To promote the socio-cultural and psychological development of children aged 1 to 18 who are deprived of parental care and live in residential institutions, children from family-type orphanages, children from families in difficult life circumstances and orphans.

Support for families with difficult life circumstances

The programme to support families in difficult life circumstances is a one-year programme that includes financial assistance, psychological and career guidance work with **10 families**. Among them are family-type orphanages, parents and guardians with children affected by the hostilities and who have taken refuge in Lviv and the region.

The project started in autumn 2022 and will continue in 2023.

The first stage of the programme, career guidance, has now been completed, with **26 programme participants gaining knowledge about career development and continuing to attend training courses. The Foundation's team also provides psychological and material support to families according to their needs.**

The project was made possible thanks to the support of GETEC Group, which provided financial assistance.

Is to give talented young people in difficult life circumstances the opportunity to study.



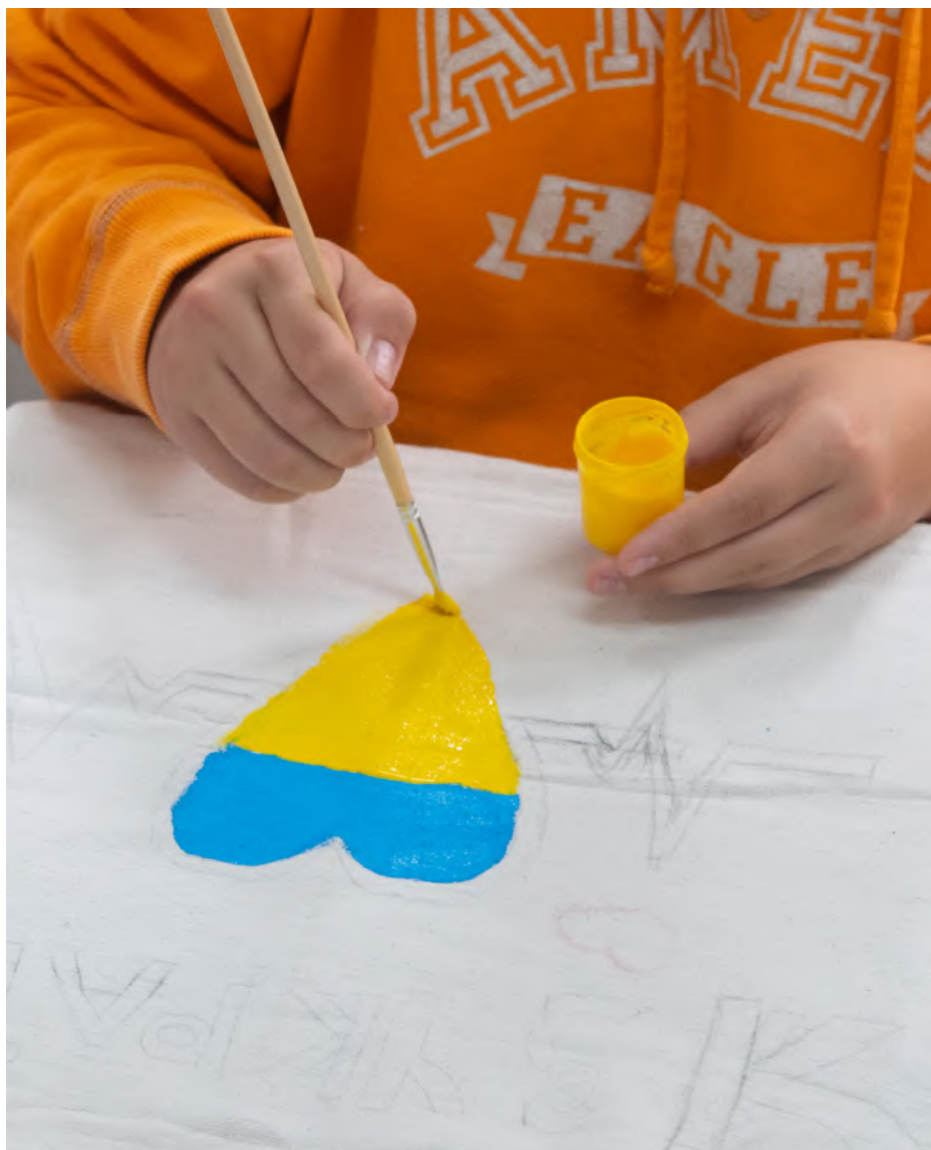
Art project «Sporidneni»

Project «Rejoice Again»

Training for professionals working with children

As part of the project, we have trained **more than 1,000 psychologists and childcare professionals.**

The training is based on a unique methodology created by the Foundation's psychologists in collaboration with art therapist Victoria Nazarevych, which helps professionals process trauma and facilitate children's ability to construct and systematise their experiences in a way that is safe and environmentally friendly for them in the future.

This is a special opportunity for professionals working with children to safely address the trauma, stabilise safety, create new meanings and legalise children's joy.

Hand Puppet Theater «Planet Ridni»

As part of the Theatre for Kids project, we developed a Hand Puppet Theater called «Planet Ridni».

The main goal of the hand puppet theatre is to help professionals establish contact with children, express their own emotions, and analyse and live them in a safe way.

The Foundation managed to send about **200 kits** for specialists, teachers, psychologists and institutions working with children affected by the war in Ukraine.



5 unique characters became the heroes: Anxiety, Anger, Shyness, as well as the girl Di and the unicorn Ri.



Psychological Game «Rejoice Together»

The foundation's team is working on the implementation of the psychological game «Rejoice Together», which aims to create conditions for overcoming crisis conditions in children and adults, restoring happiness and joy for life.

The game allows children to develop the skills to quickly adapt to new conditions of reality, see their own positive image and find emotional peace.

This year the project «Rejoice Together» project took 3rd place in the nomination

Sociological survey

«Stereotypes and prejudices of the population of Lviv region towards orphans, children deprived of parental care and different forms of family placement»

We would like to share the results of a sociological survey on the topic: «Stereotypes and prejudices of the population of Lviv region towards orphans, children deprived of parental care and different forms of family placement»

Please note that the study was conducted in November 2021 - February 2022, before the full-scale war with Russia. In connection with this and changes in the adoption process, the data obtained can only be used for information and comparison of the pre-war situation to which this study relates and the post-war situation.

The survey was conducted by the NGO «Institute of Youth» with the assistance of the State Institute of Family and Youth Policy and with the support of the company's partner «Sparrow Capital».

The report will provide you with information about existing stereotypes and prejudices among the population of Lviv and Lviv region. You will also gain a better understanding of the general readiness of the population to adopt.

With their support, the Foundation was able to provide safe accommodation for the evacuated children and ensure financial and resourcing support for medical institutions in Lviv.



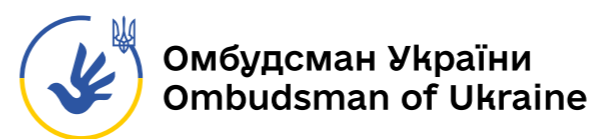
Cooperation with the Ombudsman's Office

We join forces to work together to protect the rights of children in Ukraine and abroad, including orphans and children deprived of parental care.

The cooperation will involve the implementation of cultural, humanitarian, psychological and other helpful projects in the field of child protection, as well as cooperation with international institutions and local foundations in the countries where children are staying.

As part of this cooperation, we are also preparing to implement an important project to provide comprehensive support to orphans, children deprived of parental care, children from families with children in difficult life circumstances, children affected by war, and their parents, caregivers, teachers, and social workers.

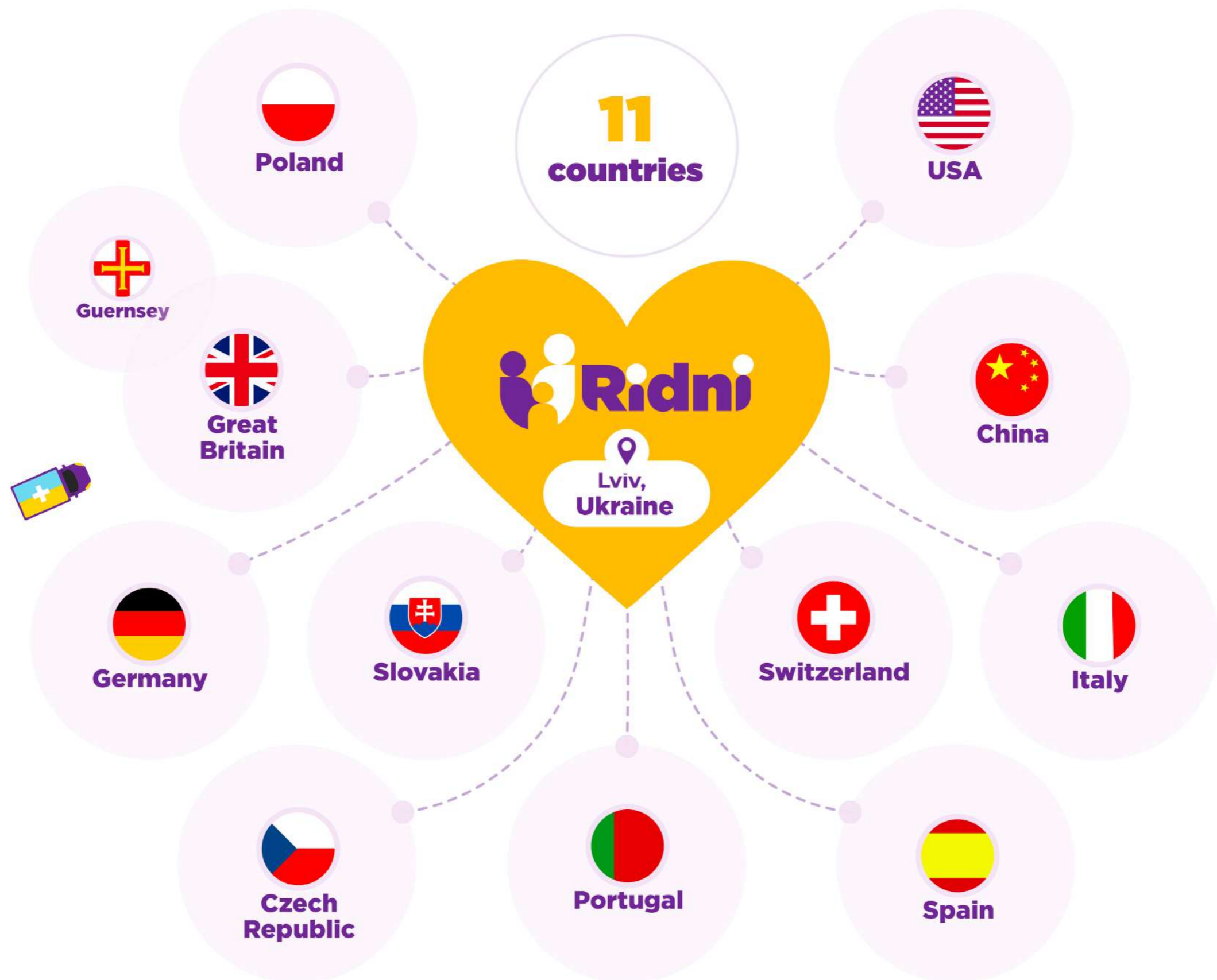

«Ridni» received strong humanitarian support from foreign partners

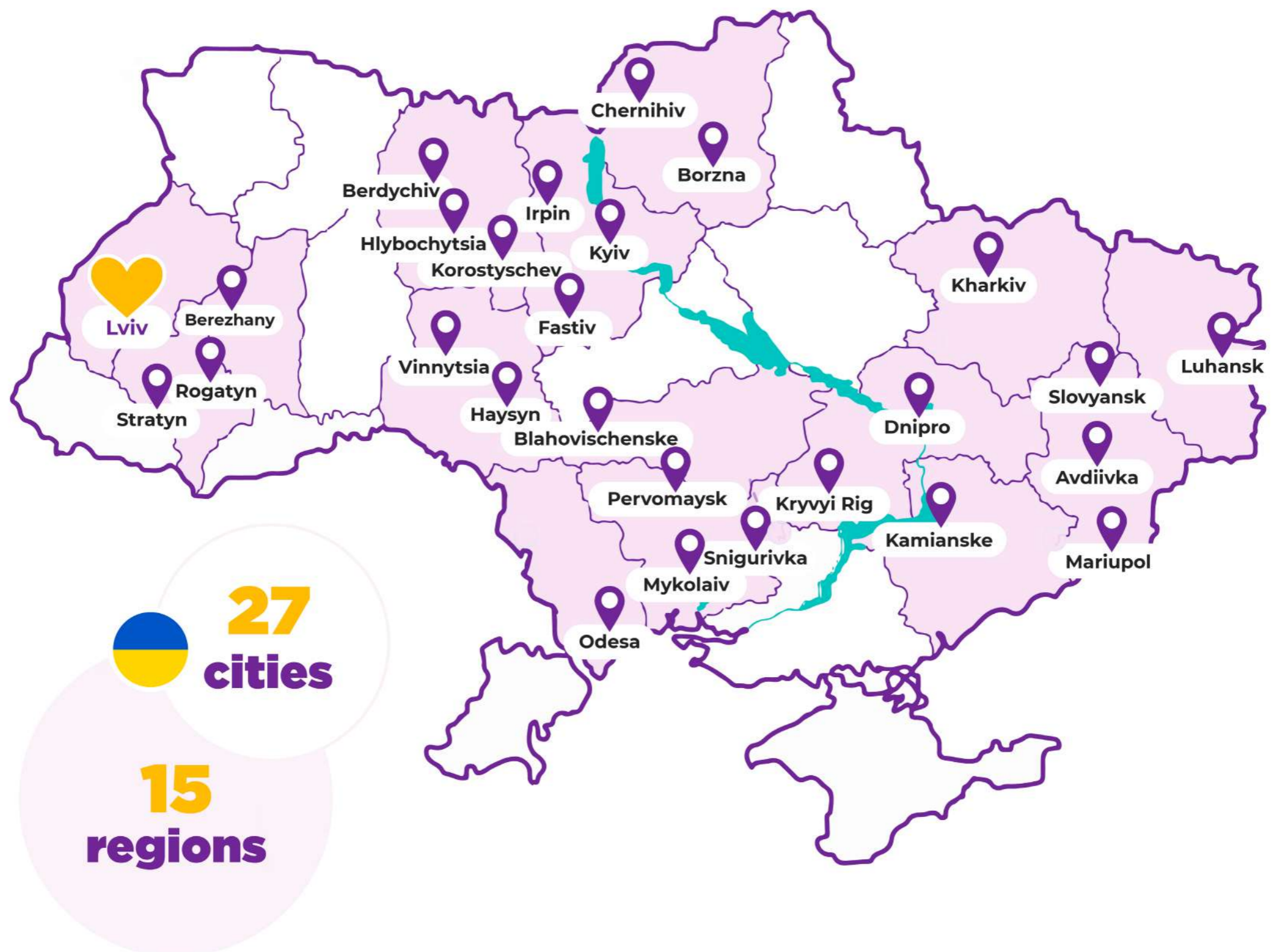

With the support of philanthropists, we managed to deliver humanitarian aid to 27 cities and 15 regions of Ukraine.

More than 200 tonnes of humanitarian aid was handed over by the Ridni team, both directly from the Foundation's humanitarian hub and from third parties engaged by the Ridni Foundation directly to the aid recipients, namely: territorial communities to provide for internally displaced persons, as well as to individuals in need who suffered as a result of Russia's military aggression against Ukraine.

More than **250 children and their guardians** have found a safe place to live abroad thanks to the Foundation's support.



The foundation's team also took care of **aid boxes for newborns** for maternity hospitals in Lviv, and systematically supported the mother and baby room at the railway station.
