spilnota



Spilnota is a unique space that offers young people a safe environment, opportunities for development, and learning on the path to adulthood. It serves as a support system for young individuals who aspire to grow and are willing to take responsibility for their lives. The cooperation between charitable foundations, local authorities, business partners and experts from various fields has helped to create a fullfledged environment for children in need, providing them not only with living conditions, but also with opportunities for development and socialisation.

The goal of Spilnota

is to shape strong personalities individuals who are not indifferent and take responsibility as citizens of Ukraine and their communities.

The Spilnota space began to work in October 2023 and was officially inaugurated in December.









The Spilnota space works in the formate of collective house for teens and youth deprived of parental care.

Non-formal education programme functions within the framework of the project comprised of thematic classes and events for its residents and 250 young people from Lviv from socially vulnerable categories.

Ridni Centre

Municipal Institution "Centre for Social Support of Children and Families «Ridni» of Lviv City Council" The main goal of the Ridni Centre is preserving families and returning a child to their family.



As part of its support for the Centre, the Foundation transferred the fully equipped premises to the Centre. It also helps to build, train and develop its team, to organise classes, excursions and workshops for children.

The Centre operates the Urgent Placement of Children department, which provides temporary accommodation and social protection for orphans and children deprived of parental care, children in difficult life circumstances, abandoned, found children and foundlings aged from birth to 18 years, as well as the Family Support Service department.



98 children	were returned to their biological families;
+ 8 children	were adopted/ taken into care;
+ 38 children	were placed in foster families and family- type children's homes;
4 foster families were created;	
+ 13 children	were placed in their next of kin families.

Results of the Ridni Centre's work

in 2023:

Over the three years of the Centre's operation, 183 children have returned to their biological families.



Thanks to our long-standing partner, GETEC international company, a playground and a football field have been built for children staying at the Ridni Centre.

Family-type children's home

Since 2016, the Foundation has been supporting **2 family-type children's homes in Lviv,** which were founded with the support of the city department of the Service for Children. Currently, these homes are home to **20 orphans** who receive all the necessary conditions for safe growth and development from caring parents and psychologists.

 In 2023, children from our family-type children's homes continue to actively pursue education in educational institutions, which indicates successful adaptation and integration into society.

Some of them have already started their career paths and found their first jobs, which indicates successful socialisation and readiness for independent living.

Psychosocial support for children, parents and professionals



Annual resource and training programme «Rejoice Again. The Power of the Game»

March-September 2023

In cooperation with the international foundation Street Child Ukraine, we implemented a year-long resource and training programme called «Rejoice Again. The Power of the Game».



The main goal of the programme

is to provide skills, support and resources to professionals involved in the processes of psychosocial support for children in times of war, making up for educational losses, mine and explosive safety, as well as logistical assistance to schools in Kyiv and Lviv regions.



The Foundation's team of psychologists has developed an integrative multi-level model for restoring a state of joy on the way to consciously regulating one's own internal states and nurturing personal integrity on the physical, emotional, cognitive and spiritual levels. Within the framework of the project, the following was carried out:

10 offline events

for training and psychological recovery of teachers, psychologists and social workers;

40 children affected by the war

took part in rehabilitation, recreation and relaxation at a camp in Truskavets;

10 schools in the Kyiv region

received material and resource support;

1,000+ specialists from 200 pre-school,

secondary and non-formal education institutions took part in these events;











Psychological game «**Rejoice Together**»

More than 100 specialists have been trained and certified and are already successfully applying the methodology in their work.

A unique methodology developed in collaboration with Victoriia Nazarevych allows children to develop the skills of quick adaptation to new conditions of reality, see their own positive image and find emotional peace.












Methodology set «Khvilyalka — assistant in the palm of your hand»

A tool that helps to release internal anxieties, teaches you to express your emotions and look for positive solutions.

 More than 1500 specialists across Ukraine use the Khvilyalka in their practice.





Collection of therapeutic fairy tales «The Tale of the Helmet / When the day will come»

The stories are intended for children of all ages and adults alike.

The collection consists of 11 cycles of prose and 1 cycle of poetic fairy tales, which partially recreate the unpleasant events caused by the war. They were written by practical psychologists who successfully completed training in fairy tale therapy under the guidance of the trainer and supervisor Liudmyla Pidlypna.

Fairy tales can be used in art therapy, including fairy tale therapy and play therapy, adapting the way of reading to the needs of each child and creating a new way of telling each time.



Methodology set «Therapeutical Hedgehogs – Mom and child»



This methodology set is an innovative approach in psychological support of children, especially in stress situations like war conflicts. The main idea of the set is to create means of support and relaxation in the shape of a staffed hedgehog which symbolises maternal care and protection.

 The methodology set is successfully used by the specialists. Over 1000 children in acute stress situation were able to acquire a new experience.












Foundation's unique products went into different parts of Ukraine and the world





St Nicholas was supported by philanthropists, including Ukrainian companies Kormotech, Romexsoft, Levi9 and Elitex.

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


Children Are Our Flowers



Photo exhibition in Switzerland SNAP THE WAR

The photo exhibition «SNAP THE WAR» was held in Switzerland (Bern) to show the world how Russia's war is killing the childhood of Ukrainian children and their chance for a happy future. The exhibition was organised in collaboration with Ukrainian photographers Mykhailo Palinchak and Roman Bordun, who shared photos from the battlefield from the first days of Russia's war against Ukraine.



«Our foundation, together with the authors of the photos, are now the voices of these children. We are appealing to you on their behalf for protection and help. Every day in Ukraine, children are killed, they get horrific injuries and traumas, children are abducted and taken to Russia, children lose their parents and relatives.




The aim of the exhibition




is to draw the attention of the international community to the consequences of war and violations of children's rights. These photos show children who have survived the horrors of war. Among them are a 2-year-old Denis, who lived for a month in the underground metro, hiding from constant shelling; a 17-year-old boy who spent a month in the basement with his fellow villagers until the Ukrainian military liberated them from the Russian invaders; and a 10-year-old boy who lost his father while he was defending the city of Irpin from the Russian invaders.






